News from the Field

National Coalition Against Domestic Violence (US) applauds the House of Representatives

for including critical funding in support of domestic violence services and survivors as a part of the HEROES Act. The HEROES Act builds on the CARES Act in providing necessary supports in response to COVID-19. Included in the HEROES Act is critical funding support for the National Domestic Violence Hotline and the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act, (some) additional protections for immigrants who experience domestic violence, and identifies domestic violence and sexual assault advocates as "essential" workers. The Global MenEngage Alliance released *Transforming Masculinities: Towards a Shared Vision* (Nov, 2019) which explores some of the latest discussions on key themes and challenges for MenEngage Alliance. It offers ways forward to ensure our collective work makes a real contribution to feminist agendas and promotes the rights of all women and girls, and people of diverse sexual orientations and gender identities.
